Professionalism at the Shelter

Thank you so much for volunteering with the Front Street Animal Shelter volunteer program! Your dedication and service valued and much appreciated. Without our volunteers, we would not be able to save lives and have the positive impact on the Sacramento community that happens now. You are each a valued member of our team and contribute to our overall success!

As part of a shelter-wide effort to increase the professionalism of our public image, we are asking that all volunteers help out.

This is just a reminder that all volunteers and staff are expected to conduct themselves in a professional manner while representing the Front Street Animal Shelter, whether at the shelter or at an offsite event.

• At orientation we discussed the fact that volunteers do not represent themselves while volunteering, rather **each of you is part of the Front Street Team and represents the Front Street Shelter to each visitor.** Manytimes you are the first and last person a shelter visitor interacts with - the impression you leave is the one that visitor will take with them.

• Each volunteer is expected to wear either a volunteer T-shirt (available for purchase from the Volunteer Store on the <u>Volunteer Resource Site</u>) or a volunteer apron at all times while volunteering. Appropriate clothing for your job is needed (ie: long pants & closed toed shoes for working in the kennels, office attire for working in the office). Volunteers are also expected to wear their name tags - if you are missing yours, please let me know and I will print a new one for you!

• Volunteers are expected to treat all fellow volunteers, staff, and animals with respect at all times. No matter how frustrating a person or animal is, we must not raise our voices or act unprofessionally - especially in front of shelter visitors!!

Thank you again for your caring spirit and your willingness to help! You are a truly valuable member of our team & much appreciated!

Doggy Do's and Don'ts:

- Please do work with each dog individually. Separate the dogs with the guillotine-door and give each dog its own one-on-one attention time.
- Please do not walk dogs after
 I0am when it is very hot out this helps prevent heat stress for our dogs!



Please do take out big dogs with the appropriate leashes and collars. All big dogs should have a martingale collar and carabiner leash. The collars are in the volunteer cubicle, and the leashes (donated by Chako) are in Janice's office. Our leashes and collars are expensive, so please do not take them home or give them to adopters. We have the VIP leashes for giveaways!

Please DO NOT do dogto-dog introductions!! That is NOT part of volunteer adoption counseling training. Dog-todog introductions should only be done by trained shelter staff.



SMART Team

Our Sacramento Missing Animal Response Team is gearing up and getting ready to make a huge impact on our shelter! This group of volunteers is setting up a system to match incoming animals with owners who are looking for them.

Did you know? Many people here in Sacramento don't know about the Front Street Animal Shelter? If they lose their pet, they don't know to come here to look for it. The SMART team is all set to change that. They are looking through Craig's List to see if any of our shelter animals have been reported lost. They are making flyers about our shelter animals and taking them out to the neighborhoods where the animal was found. They are combing through the lost animal reports and seeing if any of those animals have come into the shelter.

What are they hoping to accomplish? They want to increase the number of animals that find their way home and decrease the number of animals left here at the shelter. Right now, our

Return-to-owner rate is only 12-16% for dogs, and a dismal 1% for cats. We can do better! And we will with the help of SMART volunteers.
