Are you wondering, "Where's Waldo?"

Shortly after Waldo arrived at Front Street last August he joined Chako Pit Bull Rescue's Pit Bull University (PBU) program. Although Waldo was adopted shortly thereafter, he was returned in November due to a change in the living situation of his adopters. As a former PBU dog, Waldo was back in the program.

Anna Cambrey, coordinator for the PBU program at Front Street, writes, "Along with shelter volunteers, the PBU team worked on keeping [Waldo] calm, balanced and socialized. He was taken on long walks to Old Town, went to offsite events and given lots of love and exercise. We also promoted him heavily on social media. #whereswaldo and #waldoneedsasuperhero became frequent posts on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter.

"We love all our PBU dogs but Waldo had a special spot in everyone's hearts. He's a great example of how patience, teamwork and refusing to give up, gave a good dog a second chance at finding a great forever home."

Waldo certainly hit the jackpot when Kelly Bell, his girlfriend, Jeanna, and her son, Tyler, decided to adopt him after seeing his photograph online.

Kelly writes, "There was Waldo sitting with his tongue hanging out of his mouth and a scarf around his neck. We...started laughing and couldn't stop. It was Friday the 2nd and I happened to get out of work early and [Jeanna] was home for the weekend. After looking at Waldo's picture again, I asked her if she'd like to run to the Front Street Animal Shelter real quick and take a look at the dogs and Waldo. I had to see this dog that made me laugh out loud just from his picture alone.

"A half hour later, we pulled up to the front and were headed in the door. We asked to see Waldo and we got to spend some time with this tank of a dog. Needless to say, I was very respectful when I first stepped in the viewing area with a pit-bull. We've heard so many negative things about these dogs. But ten minutes later we were falling for him. We left the animal shelter with all the information and a smile on our faces. We got to the car and I turned to my girlfriend and said, 'We need a picture with Waldo.' We decided to run back in and the volunteers were nice enough to go back and get Waldo out of his pen. As we took the pics, we knew...Waldo was the dog for us.

"We went back to get Waldo the next day but he was at PetSmart and I remember saying to myself, 'I hope no one adopted him.' A little selfish but in our minds, he was already our dog....We waited at the shelter till he got back so we could spend time with our new addition. Waldo showed up and was his super happy self, tail wagging, and going from person to person to greet them. All the volunteers came to the front when they heard we were adopting Waldo and it just so happens that Elizabeth [Dom] was there, she was with Waldo helping train him from the beginning. I think she was happier than we were that Waldo had found a new home. If I'm correct, she was a little teary eyed also. She was so great and so helpful with offering herself as a contact in case we had any questions. We left elated that we were going to bring Waldo home the next day.

"Day three, we went to get Waldo and as they brought Waldo to the front most of the volunteers again came to the front to see Waldo off. There was lots of laughter, congratulations, hugs and kisses. It was a huge send off and it took a while to leave because no one wanted to let him go. We just want to say that the Front Street Animal Shelter volunteers are the greatest! They are so loving and caring and you can tell this simply because the animals love them so much and it showed. They were so helpful and so kind we almost felt bad for taking Waldo away. It was bitter sweet and it showed in their expressions. They were also so generous and gave us a leash (thank you to the young lady that gave it to us) and a food container to take with us. We also want to thank the person/persons who fostered Waldo and say thank you so much for paying all the adoption fees.

"And now we are happy to say we get to spend time with Waldo every day and it's still not enough. Our family is complete now. We've only had him for [a few] weeks but it feels like a lifetime that we've known him. We used to own a house, couch, beds, chairs, etc. Waldo owns them now, but he is happy to share with us as long as we love on him or he gets to hear the bedtime story being read to my girlfriend's young man. He is truly the best dog and a blessing. I don't know how we went this long without him. We just finished our first road trip to LA together, and he did fantastic. Everyone we met on the way fell in love with him and other than owning the hotel bed when we stopped for the night, he was awesome.

"Again, we want to thank the Front Street Animal Shelter and the foster parents; you people are so incredibly awesome. We love you and everything you've done for Waldo and all the animals at the Front Street Animal Shelter. Your selflessness knows no bounds and this world would truly be a better place if we all were a little more like you."
