- ◆ Clean up the Volunteer Cubicle Next time you're looking for something to do, consider crossing one of these projects off the list!


# MLK Day of Service

### **Adoption Counseling Tidbits**

Adoptions are the reason we all volunteer! We want all of our furry friends to find their fur-ever homes. Here are some tidbits to help keep everyone on the same page when helping with adoption counseling:

- ♦ Only put holds on animals until 2:30 the following day. Please don't put an "End of Day" hold on an adoptable animal unless there are special circumstances. If the hold is only til 2:30, then the new potential adopters have the opportunity to meet the animal, and the animal has the opportunity to find their home!
- ♦ Rescue Stamp on a kennel card takes priority over a potential adopter. If someone wants to look at an animal slated to go to rescue, check with an ACT they can look up in the computer to find out whether or not this animal can be pulled off of the Rescue and be adopted out, or whether the Rescue commitment is firm.
- ♦ Kitten room Kittens in the kitten room are not available for adoption unless an ACT specifically directs you to take potential adopters there. The ACT will post a sign and instruct volunteers on which kittens are available, should the need arise.

Do you love dogs? Do you volunteer with the Front Street shelter dogs or counsel potential adoptees? Do you have a dog at home whose behavior could be improved? Then you may want to read Pat Miller's book *Do Over Dogs: Give Your Dog a Second Chance for a First Class Life*.

A "Do-Over Dog" is a dog in need of training and/or behavior modification. Shelter, rescue, and stray dogs are likely candidates but there are many dogs living with families who could use a little help too.

Pat Miller, a professional dog trainer and animal behaviorist, provides practical advice and positive training tips to help "Do-Over Dogs" begin again. Below are a few of the topics discussed in her highly regarded book.


- How to assess and anticipate dog behavior and training needs.
- Ways to teach new behaviors and establish good habits during the "Honeymoon Period."
- Solutions to problem behaviors such as fear, resource guarding and separation anxiety.

  Using positive training and common sense management techniques to bring out the best in a dog.

At Amazon.com reviewers consistently give this book five stars. One reviewer suggests "Buy 3 – donate 2 to your local shelter or rescue group!!" Another remarks that it's "A great resource for all dog owners."
