- Please give single-kenneled dogs enriching toys that are size appropriate. We have a good supply of small Kongs in the laundry shed for small dogs. Fill them with tasty layers of treats for dog fun! Multiple-kenneled dogs

should not be given toys to avoid fights!

- Please keep the clipboards neat and organized - Hang at eye level across the kennels and clip the kennel card to the clipboard.
- Please do continue to do the amazing job each and everyone of you accomplish! Our staff are very grateful for the help you give and thankful for everything you do!



Meet the Citizen's Advisory Committee!

We are a committee of 7 members (currently 6 sitting members) whose purpose is to provide advisory recommendations to the mayor and city council about issues that affect the quality of care for the animals at the Front Street Shelter and to act on behalf of the community in matters related to the city's animal care services. The committee is comprised of individuals who have varying degrees of expertise with animals, from veterinarians or vet techs, those involved in animal rescue organizations, to lay people representing the community at large.

We meet monthly in a public forum, at the Front Street Shelter, to discuss matters pertaining to animal care services, which can include animals at the shelter, animal control officers, feral cat colonies, spay and neutering, animal licensing, the care or lack of care of animals in the community, and the like. These meetings are open to the public and the public is welcome to address any issues or concerns with the committee at these meetings. Over the past year, there have been great strides made in increasing the number of animals that find homes, and in reducing the number of animals that come to the shelter in the first place. We want to help ensure that this positive trend continues! None of this would be possible without the amazing dedication from staff and volunteers, those that spend their time in the front lines. Therefore, we want to hear from you, what things you have seen that have improved conditions for the animals at the shelter, and most importantly, what ideas and suggestions you have that could further benefit the animals.



- *Cages*, Peg Kehret. Kit steals a bracelet and is sentenced to twenty hours of community service at her local humane society where she learns a lot about herself and the animals. (Age 8+)
- Matilda Mae: The Dog Who Needed a Name, Sara McGaugy. Learn about homeless pets and animal adoption in an age-appropriate manner. (Age 8+)
- Rainbow Street Shelter Series: Missing! A Cat Called Buster and LOST! A Dog Called Bear, Wendy Orr. Young readers will eagerly turn the pages to see what happens to Buster and Bear. (Age 7+)
- *Shelter Dog Blues* (Martha Speaks Series), Susan Meddaugh. Martha loses her collar and ends up in the shelter where she and her family organize a show to find homes for all the shelter dogs. (Age 6+)
- *Max, the Shelter Dog* series, Nicole Rivera. Discover how Max, an energetic and misunderstood Pit Bull puppy, finds a good home. Then read other books in this delightful series. (Age 5+)
- *Before You Were Mine*, Maribeth Boelts celebrates those who support, care for, and adopt shelter dogs. Winner of the ASPCA Henry Bergh Children's Book Award. (Age 4+)
- *The Shelter Dog*, Christine Davis. A beautifully written and illustrated book about "Hero," an angel dog who chooses to become an old special needs dog at an animal shelter. (Age 4+)
