# Shelter Do's and Don'ts:

- Please DO keep the clipboards in the adoptable buildings neat and up to date! Extra clipboards are in the sink cubbies and the kennel notes are in the Volunteer Area.
- ◆ Please DO respect the chain of command!! Please address vet questions to Dr. Warner or Cynthia, and any other questions or concerns to Janice.
- ◆ Please DO take as much training as possible especially if you have not taken training for more than a year. We are continually updating our procedures and policies in order to best serve the animals we care for. If you taken our series of Dog Training classes in the past year, we need to do so now! We want everyone working with our dogs in the same, consistent manner.
- ♦ Please DO NOT leave kennels unlatched!! Please check the kennel doors after cleaning to ensure that they are both padlocked and latched properly-small dogs can (and have) escape from unlatched kennels!!

Dog walkers who have not taken any shelter training in the last year should sign up to take our Dog Training classes!!

# Does Your Employer Match?

# Kennel Cough: What can we do to prevent the spread?

Many of you may be aware of the fact that our dogs and cats are susceptible to kennel cough here at the shelter. But what is kennel cough? Kennel cough is an upper respiratory infection that is contagious from dog to dog or cat to cat. It can be caused by a combination of a virus and the Bordetella bronchiseptica bacteria. It is treated with a series of antibiotics.

The thing about kennel cough? It is entirely preventable! Just like keeping your hands clean and washing them frequently will help keep **you** from catching a cold, simple sanitation will help prevent the spread of kennel cough here at the shelter.

For cats: Sanitize your hands between handling each cat and change gloves between each kennel when cleaning. If we all did that, we would have much fewer sick cats!!

**For dogs:** Sanitize your hands between dogs. If you are training with a dog that has kennel cough, change your apron before working with another dog. Wash the leashes

regularly—they are washable and can go into the laundry.

Wouldn't it be nice to walk down our kennels and not see any sick animals? If we all work together, we can achieve this!



# How Volunteering With Animals Will Help You Live Longer

You always knew there was a good reason for you to volunteer at the Front Street Shelter—here's proof! Check out this article by Abigail Geer: "Volunteering with animals is a great way to make a difference and give something back, but it doesn't stop there!

Turns out, thanks to a new study linking volunteering to longevity, there may be more



reasons to muck in at one of your local animal shelters.

So apart from feeling all warm and fuzzy inside knowing that you're doing a good thing, you can also take comfort in the knowledge that you'll live longer than those who've never volunteered.

Studies examining the interactions between humans and animals show similar results when it comes to the hormone oxytocin, and specifically how the bonds we share with animals are woven from the same stuff that merges mothers and infants, and that's just the start of it. Oxytocin is very beneficial for us. It increases feelings of happiness and trust, and has a powerful effect on the body's ability to heal, and even to grow new cells.

Growing research shows that the value of human-animal bonding can play a crucial role in child development, elderly care, dementia, mental illness, abuse and trauma recovery, physical impairment, and the rehabilitation of incarcerated youths and adults.

Spending time with animals is therapeutic in so many ways, from relationship building to mood boosting and
