Help needed for World Rabies Day!

On Saturday, September 28th the Front Street Animal Shelter is going for a world record! In partnership with the Sacramento Valley Veterinary Medicine Association and other local shelters, the Front Street Animal Shelter will be one of several locations to give out free rabies vaccinations, free micro-chips, and free pet-licenses. We are proud to be part of this world record attempt at the most micro-chips given in a day! This is doubly exciting, as this is a brand new record—no one has ever recorded micro-chipping before!

There are two ways to help!

The first is to help with the World Rabies Day activities here at the shelter. There are two shifts 7:30-1:00 or 12:30-6:00. Morning shift will help with set up and afternoon shift will help with clean up. In addition to the World Rabies Day activities, which are open to all volunteers regardless of

experience, we will still need help with our basic shelter chores and adoption counseling as usual. Sign up today on your MyVolunteerPage profile!

The second way to help is to be a World Record Official. We need witnesses and scribes at each location. These witnesses and scribes cannot be affiliated with the location they are observing, so you would be stationed at another site. For those of you who were able to come to the first annual Paws to Party fundraiser for the Front Street Animal Shelter, we don't

need to tell you it was a rockin' good time! We had lots of great food, wine, beer and danced to the tunes of the amazing Roni & the Flight. Guests battled over some great silent auction items - the fiercest battle by far was for a catering event from Drewski's Hot Rod Kitchen! The evening ended with a huge raffle.

The most important thing about this event? We raised a lot of money for the shelter programs! Our total net for this event was almost \$27,000! This money will go towards saving more animals, supporting our outreach efforts, and supporting our community event. Thank you Sacramento for a wonderful evening!



Offsite Outreach Outrageousness!

There is a reason why over the past year we adopted out 1,501 dogs and 1,003 cats. That reason is offsite adoption events! We have scheduled no less than two adoption or outreach events each weekend - and sometimes as many as six in one weekend! We are becoming a part of the Sacramento community and participating in many different types of events—from the Pride Parade to the Tamale Festival and, of course, the more familiar pet store events. We even crash other events with just a couple of dogs in Adopt Me vests!

None of this would be possible without volunteers. We have volunteers who lead the events, volunteers who handle animals, and volunteers who counsel potential adopters. We need more volunteers to participate in these adoption events - if every eligible volunteer committed to doing just one adoption event per month, we could add hundreds of more events! Sign up today through your MyVolunteerPage profile and help us show the Sacramento community what an awesome shelter we are!

Here are some guidelines to make offsite events successful and fun for everyone:

- You must watch the dog that you are assigned to at all times! That is your number one priority - keep the dog safe and keep visitors safe. Don't let your dog wander behind you!
- Only trained volunteers who are signed up through the Front Street volunteer program and have completed all of the necessary trainings may participate in our

events. You may not bring family or friends to offsite events unless they have taken all of the required training and be a part of our team. (Dog offsite volunteers must have taken Dog II, Cat offsite volunteers must have taken the Cattery Class.)

- Be a Shelter Ambassador! Be sure that what you are saying to visitors about shelter policy, statistics or programs is accurate. Do your research! Shelter Ambassador training materials are available on the Volunteer Resource Site.
- Commit to the whole event only commit to those events that
 you know you will be able to stay
 for the whole shift!

Become an OUTRAGEOUS Offsite Outreach Ambassador today! Don't forget to sign up for at least two offsite events per month. You can help our dogs and cats get adopted!

- Please DO keep the clipboards in the adoptable buildings neat and up to date! Separate the dogs with the guillotine-door and give each dog its own one-on-one attention time.
- Please DO NOT take out dogs
 that are too big for you to
 handle!! Please use your good
 judgment and be cautious when
 taking dogs out. We want to
 prevent injuries to volunteers and dogs alike. Instead, work
 with them in their kennels to teach basic manners.
- Please DO take as much training as possible especially if you have not taken training for more than a year. We are continually updating our procedures and policies in order to best serve the animals we care for.
- Please DO NOT throw away broken Karunda beds. We use these for parts - purchasing new ones costs over \$80!
- Please DO log your hours and sign up online! We need to be able to know who is expected to work a shift or event, and we need to know how many hours you are working!


Staff committed to finding them a home together. They went up for adoption together in the cattery (Yes, a dog in the cattery!) and quickly found their new forever home. They were adopted together on

always had a passion for animals. During high school she interned at the Marin Humane Society. In 1999, she


